VIII LONG ANSWER

Both "Mrs. Packletide's Tiger" and "Dear Departed" offer sharp criticism of their female characters through their focus on trivialities.

In "Mrs. Packletide's Tiger," Mrs. Packletide is driven by her desire to outshine her rival, Loona Bimberton. Her aim of

superficial achievements, like shooting a tiger to gain social fame highlights her vanity and competitive nature. She gives importance to

social prestige over empathy, making her actions seem shallow and motivated by petty jealousy.

In "Dear Departed," the female characters Amelia and Elizabeth are portrayed as selfserving and materialistic. Their concern over the division of their father's belongings, rather than grieving his death, heightens their greed and lack of familial bond. Their verbal fights over trivial things colours them as heartless and small, more interested in material gain than emotional connection.

These characters' emphasis on insignificant things highlights their weak, self-centered personalities.
